

## Fight against plagiarism at UNamur:

### looking for excellence in Teaching and Research!

**Plagiarism is an issue that concerns all of us** regardless of our place in the university (as a student, a researcher, an assistant and/or an academic). Plagiarize is neither ethical nor professional, and it goes against the **values of UNamur : intellectual rigor, respect of the other's work, quality of information, to behave with integrity, ...**

**Whenever you use information** (texts, graphs, drawings, images, analysis, reasoning, development of an idea, etc.) **taken from someone else's work** (paper or electronic-version), **there is plagiarism if :**

- you do not properly quote its original author (and put the references in the text and/or the source where you took this information);
- you do not use quotation marks or any other form of explicit identification that can distinguish your own ideas from those you have taken elsewhere.

## Tips and Tricks to prevent plagiarism

### Identify your sources

- Put quotation marks when you copy and paste an excerpt from a text of another author;
- Use footnotes to quote correctly your sources (author, title, edition, year of publication, pages cited);
- Make a 'bibliography' where all references (authors, texts, images, web pages, etc. used to illustrate your work) will be found.

### Respect the copyright!

- Don't plunder someone else's work, copyright only allows you to quote excerpts from a text (don't copy the complete work!)
- If you translate a text, identify your translation as such and put the excerpt in the original language in a footnote;
- Always cite your sources and assign authorship of all information (images, graphs, data, pictures, etc.) that you insert into your text.

### LEARN FROM THE OTHERS!

- Education & training: at UNamur there are several courses in methodology and/or about intellectual property depending on your studies or research area;
- Specific seminars will be organized by the Pro-Doc cell (assistance & training for PhD's) and by the Research Administration (ADRE);
- Ask your assistants, professors and/or colleagues, supervisors, research directors... they are also there to supervise, assist, teach and to provide you this kind of knowledge!
